This three-bedroom residence offers the chance to live in New York's newly redone Waldorf Astoria, a building that enjoys a prominent place in U.S. history.

Celebrating 91 years on <u>Manhattan</u>'s Park Avenue this year, the Waldorf Astoria was the tallest and largest hotel in the world when it opened in 1931; it was also among the most luxurious and is considered to be an outstanding example of classic <u>Art Deco</u> <u>architecture</u>.

The Waldorf has hosted an untold number of politicians and celebrities in its time and is set to reopen in 2024 with both a hotel and condominiums. Jean-Louis Deniot, the acclaimed Paris-based interior designer, created the aesthetic for the 375 homes in the residential portion of the building known as The Towers of the Waldorf Astoria, including Residence 3406.

Overlooking St. Bartholomew's Church and Park Avenue, the property has a dramatic entryway of a lacquered front door with brass inlays and bronze fixtures and a foyer with marble floors.

"The entrances have room to breathe, as though the exterior front door of a townhouse," Mr. Deniot said, in speaking about his design for the front. "When you step inside, there is a beautiful marble floor, the first sensation is that of light and a coolness from the marble beneath your feet."

Set in a corner, the 40-foot-long living and dining area he designed are prime for entertaining and get an abundance of natural light.

The kitchen features custom cabinets from Molteni and Gaggenau appliances and is just off the gallery that leads to the bedrooms. The primary suite stands out for its two walk-in closets and bathroom with a generously sized freestanding soaking tub and striking white marble walls; the heated mosaic marble tile floors add a luxurious touch.

Mr. Deniot told Mansion Global that he used an enfilade—an axial arrangement of doorways that connects rooms—to make the apartment appear larger than it actually is. "When you stand in the space, you can see the full length and full width, creating a sense of spaciousness," he said. "Even the tiniest of spaces can look and feel grand."

The 2,529-square-foot home offers three bedrooms and three and a half bathrooms

#### Amenities

Residents can avail of more than 50,000 square feet of private amenities. Mr. Deniot designed all of the spaces, including the fitness center, swimming pool, spa, theater with a stage and movie screen, four bars, gaming room with poker table, room with a pool table and multiple dining rooms.

### Neighborhood Notes

The Waldorf Astoria is located in Midtown Manhattan, a central part of town that's within walking distance from major tourist attractions such as Fifth Avenue, the upscale boutiques on Madison Avenue, Central Park, vibrant restaurants and subways. Grand Central Terminal is less than a 10-minute walk away, and grocery stores are also nearby.
